for composers is offered for competition in 2020. The value of the Scholarship is £8,000 with the possibility of inclusion of a work in the City Music Society (London) concert series.

RULES FOR THE COMPETITION

- 1. Music students of either sex below the age of 30 on 1st April 2020 are eligible, provided that they are resident in Britain or any part of Ireland. The qualification for election is 'a decided talent for music, exhibited in composition'.
- Candidates should submit three compositions, one of which must be accompanied by a recording. The compositions may be either in manuscript or in published form, and suitably bound. Do not send loose sheets of manuscript. A recording must also be submitted where the composition contains a significant electronic component.
- 3. The award shall be expended by the elected Scholar in furtherance of his/ her musical education in Britain and/or visits to and tuition in musical centres abroad. The Scholar must also undertake to submit a scheme of work to be approved by the Trustees, and to send a report of studies undertaken, to the Trustees.
- 4. The Committee may interview short-listed competitors. It reserves the right to withhold the Scholarship.
 - The award will be announced as soon as possible after the Committee has met in May 2020.
- 5. The candidate must complete the attached entry form and return it to the Hon Secretary together with a cheque (payable to The Mendelssohn Scholarship Foundation) for £15 (to cover postage and administration), a photocopy of his/her birth certificate, three compositions, and a recording of one of the compositions, by not later than FRIDAY 3rd APRIL 2020 to the address below.
